

#### From Our Team Vicar ...

Lent is an important season in the church's year, as we look forward to the joys of Easter. There is a definite feeling of the 'now and not yet'. We see signs of Easter hope around us — the daffodils and spring flowers are bursting into life and the chocolate eggs are jostling for space on the shop shelves.



Even though we see the signs,

we are not there yet! We have to prepare. We have to get ready. This is what we do during Lent; we give ourselves a spiritual health check, and allow God to show us the values he would have us embrace as Easter approaches.

We might apply our Lenten spiritual health-check to how we respond to things that happen in the news, and especially to what is happening in Ukraine.

At the time of writing, the world is watching on as Ukraine is devastated by the actions of the Russian state. Russia and Ukraine are neighbours, with a long and complex history. The destruction, death and desolation wrought by the Russian forces is hard to watch. It leaves us feeling a mix of anger, impotence and terrible sadness. There are three things we can do, as we respond, and they all fit with how we are encouraged to engage with the season of Lent.

#### 1st April: Fool's Day

In years gone by, the rules surrounding April Fool were this: between midnight and noon on 1<sup>st</sup> April, everyone is 'fair game' to be made a fool of. It is the morning of the practical joke. But the aim is not just to discomfort the victim: he must be tricked into taking action himself, sent on a 'fool's errand'.

And so children would be sent to the dairy for a pint of dove's milk, or to the bookseller for *The Life of Eve's Mother*. Practical jokes on a bigger scale were played: in 1860 a vast number of people received an official looking invitation to the Tower of London that read: 'Admit the Bearer and Friends to view the Annual Ceremony of Washing the White Lions.' Precisely the same trick had been played in 1698.

Then, on the stroke of noon, tradition decrees, April Fools is finished. If anyone attempts devilry thereafter, even while the clock is still striking, it recoils on his own head. A child would then race through the sing-song formula: 'April-Fool-Day's-past-and-gone-you're-the-fool-and-l-am-none!'

# Tractors and Trees! News from the Edenbridge & Oxted Agricultural Show

With so many celebrations for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee throughout 2022, we wanted to be a part of the fun and to get behind the initiative to plant trees in honour of the occasion.

The Show has been lucky enough to receive 400 saplings from The Woodland Trust to plant on our Showground at Ardenrun. This is really exciting as we're keen to provide a great habitat that helps birds and wildlife to thrive and improve the biodiversity of our land.

We'll be using most of the saplings to form a new length of hedge in the field adjoining Tandridge Lane, with various young trees also planted around the Showground.

In the spirit of the Jubilee tree planting project, we'd like to involve local people in the activity, so the gates will be open on Sunday  $10^{th}$  April and the public are invited to lend a hand. As an added attraction, there's a chance to see a fantastic collection of vintage tractors that day too.



The South Eastern Vintage Agricultural Club (SEVAC) are holding a charity road run, specifically for crank-handle tractors to take a trip out. They'll be gathering at the Showground in the morning, leaving for their run at around 10.30am and returning at around 12.30pm. We'll be planting the saplings from 10am until 2.30pm, so people are welcome to join us at a convenient time to see these magnificent tractors all together and to help do their bit for the planting project.

SEVAC will be running a barbecue and Oxted-based bar hire company Hops & Bubbles will be selling refreshments on what we hope will be a great spring day. Staff and trustees from the Show will be on hand if you'd like to talk to us about the event, to join us as a member or sponsor or to find out more about how we look after the 120 acres our charity owns.

Don't forget to put the 2022 Show dates on the calendar too — we'll be back celebrating farming and the countryside with our traditional agricultural show on 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> August! #### The Queen's Green Canopy



The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee".

The Tandridge Community played their part to enhance our environment by planting **70** trees during the official planting season on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2022. The trees are planted along the Greensand Way opposite the Barley Mow going towards the A22.

A final ceremonial tree will be planted on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend, by the Knight Family.

A plaque will be erected at the beginning of the Jubilee Green Canopy walk with all the names of people who sponsored a tree.

With a focus on planting sustainably, the 70 trees will create a legacy in honour of The Queen's leadership of the Nation, which will benefit future generations.

The Queen's Green Canopy will dedicate a network of 70 Ancient Woodlands across the United Kingdom and identify 70 Ancient Trees to celebrate Her Majesty's 70 years of service.

A further batch of

hedgerow trees from the Woodland Trust arrived last Thursday. These were planted on Sunday  $13^{\rm th}$  March 2022 carrying on from the end of the 70 trees carrying on the green walk to the A22.

#### Storm Eunice—Friday 18th February 2022

Storm Eunice was one of the most powerful to affect the south of England since the Great Storm of 1987. Tandridge did not escape its impact, with power cut off from Friday to Sunday evening. Our photos show some of the tree damage in Tandridge Lane, just before Brook Farm going south thank you to Maria Herman and Francine de Stoppelaar respectively. Alistair Roberts and the power generation crew did a fantastic job in the rain and still strong winds.





#### Farming News - March 2022

In my last article I had a moan about rising costs and Teslas. It didn't do me any good. The prices of fertiliser, chemicals and spares are shooting up. People driving Teslas are not paying £1.70 a litre for diesel. What do I know? In my defence Mr Putin hadn't unleashed armies and brought the world closer to world war than most people can remember. I've had 'the' conversation with Aaron, my son, about what to do if things went really wrong, which seemed somewhat surreal. Growing up in the late 1970s and early 1980s we were used to it. Public Information films about nuclear war, the Berlin Wall and talk of arms treaties were normal. To him, I probably sounded like my grandfather recounting tales of slit trenches and shooting Panzers over open sights in the desert.

Storm Eunice was a timely reminder of our reliance on anything which comes to us through a wire — phones, electricity and internet. UK Power Networks and their tree contractors did sterling work getting everything working again in appalling conditions. John Nicholas, who was meant to be at home with Covid, came out on his tractor with his son-in-law, Bruce and a chainsaw to clear trees from Paygate Wood off Miles Lane. I had a trundle round with my JCB and a grab shoving trees off the lanes and then helped to clear Tandridge Lane of the fallen oak tree from John's field. I saw the oak come down. I was watching the tall pine tree by my front gate swaying from side to side and then, above the sound of the storm, there was a loud crack and down came the oak.

That tree must have been there for 300 years or more. It has been a seasonal barometer for generations of farmers, locals and wildlife. John's granddaughter had her fourth birthday party under the tree last summer. How many cattle at Brook Farm have, at different times sheltered from the sun, wind and rain?

The village has made a good start planting an avenue of trees along the Greensand way as part of the celebrations for the Queen's Jubilee. As a project the trees will add to the pleasure of everyone using the Greensand Way. They are not much more than twigs at this stage, but if we can nurture them, they should do well. It would be immensely satisfying to see if, in 300 years' time, just one of the 140 plus trees we are planting comes close to matching the beauty and majesty of the oak that was brought down.

I do not hold deeply religious convictions, but I value the beauty and diversity of what we have around us. I was having one of my regular walks around a field of oilseed rape the other week and inspecting a recently cleaned out ditch when a kingfisher flew past me at waist height, dipped down to skim the water in the ditch and then landed on some blackthorn in the hedge. It was a clear bright morning and I just stopped. Every movement it made caused it to change colour in the low sun. I was captivated. After a minute or two it flew off towards the river and I went home for a late breakfast, which sounds like an anti-climax, but I felt so lucky.

kept them engrossed throughout the week. The wonders of non-Newtonian fluids, for example, certainly appealed to everyone, not just the younger

Well, we have meteorically sprung into the season of spring, so let's hope the wind and rain soon disappear to be replaced with beautiful sunshine. It is a fact that children actually grow faster in the spring than at any other time in the year. Our children are definitely doing that, in all senses


of the word. They started the new half term with a positive spring in their steps as they joyfully ventured into school, clear of portacabins.

It has been a very exciting but busy time for St Peter's School as we can now officially say we are 'back to normal', not only in terms of the relaxing of Covid restrictions, but that we are all finally back in the school building



where we belong. Yes, I will admit the novelty of portacabins did wear off pretty swiftly, so the delight on seeing them removed, was just brilliant! I do apologise for any disruption that was caused for road users when these were taken away. Even I could see that the vehicles brought to site were never going to make it up the hill!

The children have the use of the playground again. What a joy it is to see them all interacting and enjoying the full space, which now seems quite vast. It is also



lovely to see the Tandridge Pre-School children being able to use our space once again. It definitely does feel like we are returning to 'normal' times.

We got off to a very busy start to the new half term with a fantastic Science Week. The children discovered the wonders of science and STEAM through an array of activities and

On a more practical level, the only other thing on the farm which has come anywhere near the ability of a kingfisher to change colour is a block of four fields of barley at Chathill. Anyone who has walked along the footpath will have seen the barley exhibit every shade of yellow and green as it has suffered or responded to all the changes in the weather. Hopefully as it has now had a dose of fertiliser it will start to stay green.

Rupert, Zoe and I have been planting a hedge on some land we have on top of the Downs along the Croydon Road for the last two days. We have marked out a 2.5-acre corner of a field which is then going to be planted with native deciduous trees as part of the woodland creation work we are doing across the estate. It is hard work—200m in a day and a half, seven plants to the metre in a staggered double row on a steep hill. We have 100m to finish the job tomorrow. Luckily the other 2000 metres planted elsewhere on that block of land were planted by a gang of contractors, which took them five of the six days. What it will mean is that a block of five fields covering 90 acres will now have hedgerows between each field that will provide feed and cover for birds as well as a network of routes between woods for small mammals.

We took advantage of the drier weather this spring to spread some compost. This has been worked in to the soil, once everyone had savoured the aroma, and then we have planted 100 acres of spring beans. We still have 150 acres of spring oats, 100 acres of spring rape and 50 acres of maize still to plant. Given the current circumstances about the price of wheat, it would be tempting to have planted spring wheat, but most of the land we are planting now has already had one or two crops of wheat before this year and we needed to give the land a rest from wheat to break any disease cycles. Most of what we are planting needs lower inputs than wheat and if the price of wheat is high, then most other commodities will tend to trade higher anyway, so we shouldn't lose out.

As always at this time of year, the weather in the next few weeks will set the tone for the



rest of the farming year up until harvest. We are being offered forward sale prices on crops that until recently were the stuff of dreams, which seems wrong given that the horror in Ukraine has been caused by one man's hubris. Given the corresponding sky-high prices of all the fertiliser, sprays and fuel we need to grow those crops and restock for next year, we will need every penny. Farmers ought to get free membership of Gamblers Anonymous. We gamble with the weather to be able to grow and harvest crops and then we gamble, directly or indirectly, with the world's commodity markets to sell our produce to a system that usually has a return on capital of one or two percent. This year the numbers and risks seem even greater. Alastair
