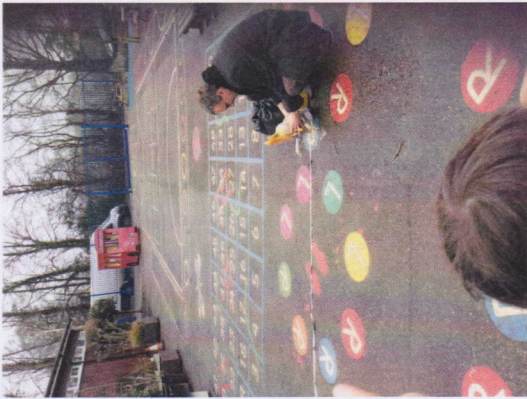

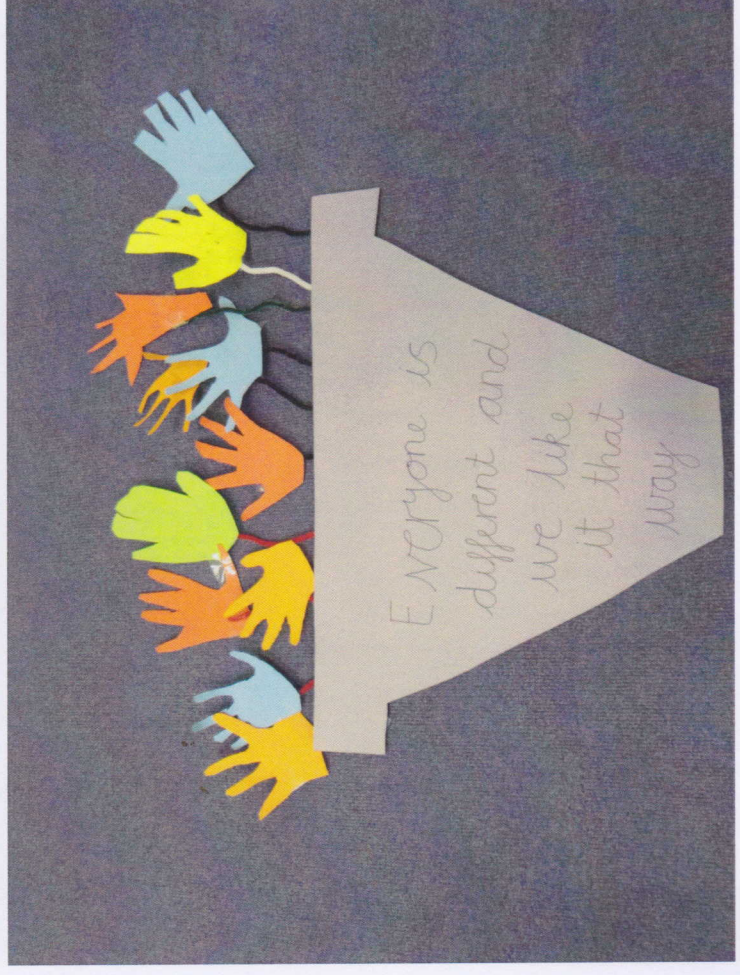

### Heating in church

No doubt many readers have been watching their fuel bills over this last winter and so has your parish church. Last October we reduced the 'room' thermostat down by 2 deg C to 17 deg C. Also we adjusted the crude mechanical time switch as finely as we could so that the church was not heating unnecessarily. It was once thought that the heating would have to come on by 4am to warm the church sufficiently for the 8am service. Now the church will only be 'pre-heated' from two hours before the service.

To save time and energy travelling to the church to make those adjustments to the time switch, we are investigating an electronic time switch which, by utilising our Wifi system in church, with which we can adjust the time switch remotely e.g from home.

We recently compared our winter quarter (Nov-Feb) (2022-2023) gas bill with the same quarter last year, and discovered by using the above measures, we have saved £915 in gas. We hope to improve on that next year!

And in with the new

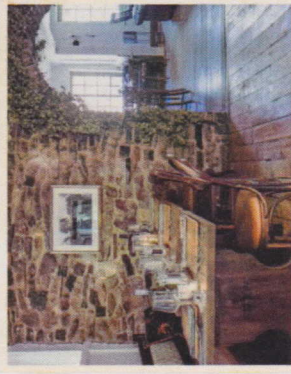

HM Royal Yacht Britannia—70years ago

Seventy years ago, on 16<sup>th</sup> April 1953, Queen Elizabeth II launched the Royal Yacht Britannia. It was decommissioned in 1997. The Royal Family no longer owns a royal yacht.

Britannia was the 83rd such vessel since King Charles II acceded to the throne in 1660, but the first Royal Yacht to be built with complete ocean-going capacity and designed as a Royal residence to entertain guests around the world.

She was decommissioned in 1997, when the Government decided she was too expensive to repair, although she had raised £3 billion in commercial days between 1991 and 1995. Moves have been made to replace her, but they have so far come to nothing. She is currently moored in Leith, Edinburgh, and attracts 300,000 visitors a year.

Built by John Brown & Co, one of the world's most famous shipyards, she was commissioned into the Royal Navy on 11<sup>th</sup> January 1954, and on 22<sup>nd</sup> April sailed into her first overseas port, Malta. In 44 years, the Britannia sailed the equivalent of once round the world each year, calling at over 600 ports in 135 countries.

Britannia's final mission was to bring the last Governor of Hong Kong, Chris Patten, back from Hong Kong after its handover to the People's Republic of China in July 1997. The Queen was reported to have shed a tear at the decommissioning ceremony, which was attended by most of the senior members of the Royal Family.

All the clocks on board are stopped at 3:01pm, the time the Queen was piped ashore for the last time.

## The launch of 'Bell Sunday' in May

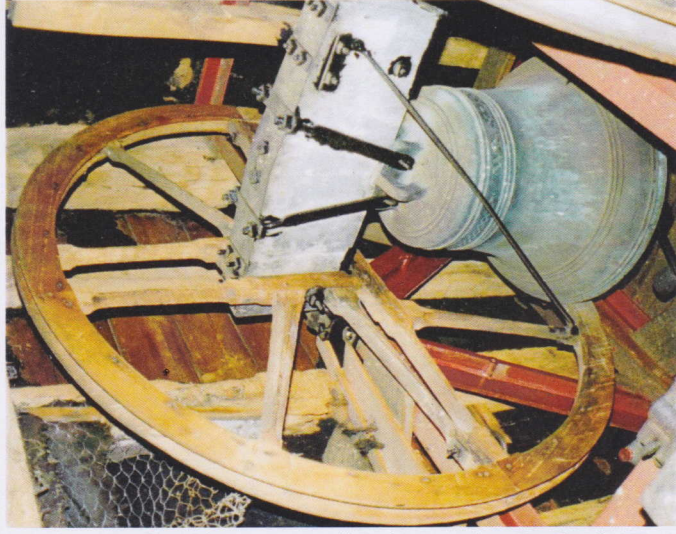
If you like church bells, you will be pleased to hear that there is now an 'official' Bell Sunday - this year to be held on 14<sup>th</sup> May.

It will be held each year on the Sunday closest to 19<sup>th</sup> May. That is because 19<sup>th</sup> May is the feast day of St Dunstan, who way back in the 11<sup>th</sup> century had fun in experimenting with bell-forging. (Does anyone know if any of his bells have survived?)

The Central Council for Church Bell Ringers (CCCBR) has declared Bell Sunday to encourage churches to celebrate their bells and ringers in Sunday worship.

The CCCBR hopes that many local church towers will join in, and that, where possible, churches will open their towers to the public on the day, so that visitors can watch the bells being run.

The Central Council's spokeswoman, Vicki Chapman, says: "With co-operation between church and bell-ringers, it may be possible for bell-ringers to be involved in a service on the day. Bell ringers could read lessons, give a talk, and demonstrate the playing of handbells. The church service could include bell-related hymns, bell-related prayers, and even bell-shaped biscuits with the after-service coffee. "We hope that Bell Sunday will help raise awareness of the importance of bells in our communities, and also help strengthen relationships between clergy Stand bellringers."

The Nelson Mass was written 225 years ago in turbulent and anxious times after Napoleon Bonaparte had defeated the Austrian army in four major battles and was threatening Vienna itself. Political and economic turmoil in the war-torn country was widespread, so much so that Haydn was limited in the musicians he had at his disposal. Prince Nicolaus II had dismissed the wind players for budgetary reasons, so the resourceful Haydn set the mass for strings, organ, trumpets and timpani only. Haydn restored the winds in a subsequent edition and it is the complete orchestration that will be heard in May. The result is an impassioned work of great drama, which has become one of Haydn's best-loved works.

Haydn deemed this setting the Missa in Angustiis or Mass for Troubled Times (which certainly resonates with today's global problems) yet it was first performed on the day that Nelson defeated Napoleon at the Battle of the Nile – and hence is commonly known as the Nelson Mass.

The local choir will be accompanied by a professional orchestra and highly accomplished and talented soloists from the Royal Academy of Music: Emilia Bertolini (Soprano); Hera Protopapas (Mezzo-Soprano); Guy Benon (Tenor) and Alex Bower-Brown (Baritone).

The Summer Concert will be held in the Bawtree Hall, Hazelwood School, Oxted on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> May at 7.00pm. 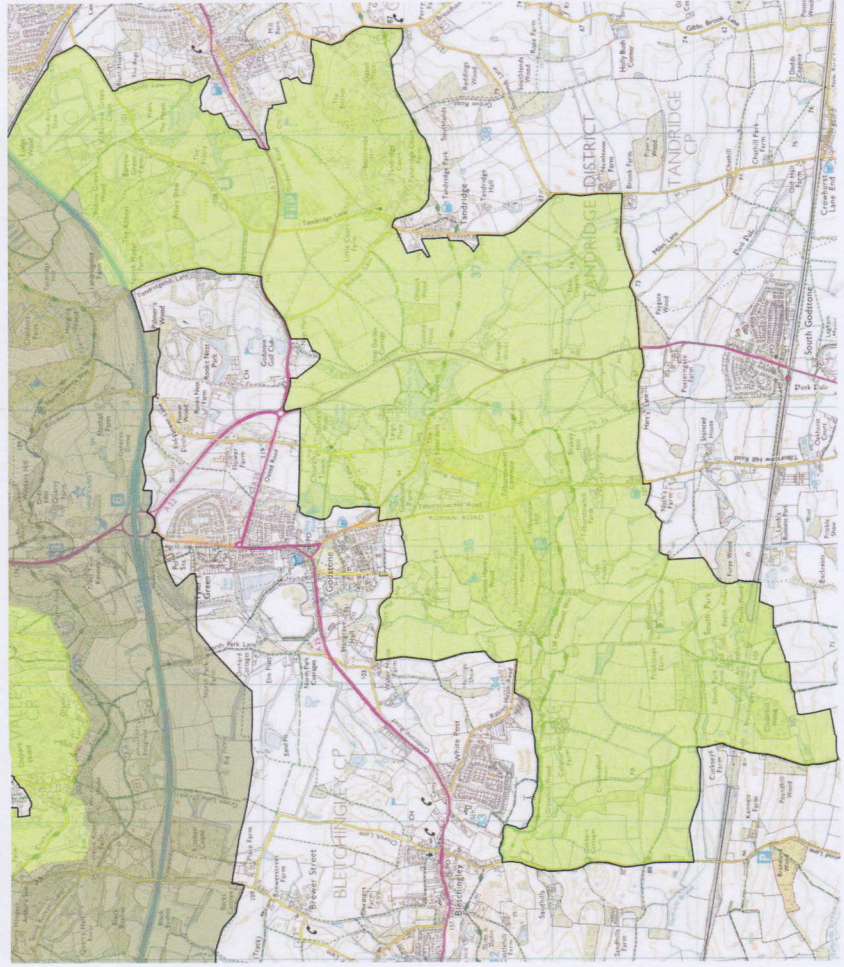
